JAC announces another stir against NEHU VC

Demand to recall 'illegal' appointment of technical officer/senior consultant

SHILLONG, Oct 29: The Joint Action Committee (JAC) comprising NEHUTA, NEHUSU, and NEHUNSA has decided to intensify its agitation against NEHU Vice Chancellor, Prabha Shankar Shukla by resorting to a non-cooperation movement starting with the Academic Council meeting on October 31.

The JAC took this decision in view of the VC's failure to comply with the deadline to remove the "illegally appointed" contractual technical officer/senior consultant, Rohit Prasad by midnight of October 26.

JAC chairman, Lakhon Kma on Sunday said the VC neither accepted the deadline for removing Prasad nor initiated any process to fulfill the long-pending issues of the three NEHU associations. "We have been left with no alternative other than going ahead with an all-out protest starting with the non-participation in the 111th Academic Council meeting scheduled to be held on Tuesday," he said.



He said the VC was supposed to fulfill the JAC's demands in a time-bound manner other than removing Prasad immediately. The demands include the immediate appointment of the statutory officers, a university engineer, and the director of the CDC.

"The VC should undertake steps to address the deteriorating condition of the University Health Centre (non-availability of medicines, lack of testing

facilities, etc.)," Kma said.

Among the other demands of the JAC are issuing an advertisement for recruitment in non-teaching posts, procurement of chemicals and reagents needed for the practical and research work of Ph.D. scholars, relieving the teaching faculties and technical staff of ministerial duties, holding of regular convocations, and plugging security lapses within the campus.

"We will organise a general assembly of the JAC on Tuesday coinciding with the Academic Council meeting to deliberate on our agenda. All the members of the JAC, Meghalaya Tribal Teachers' Association, and the Research Scholars' Forum, NEHU have been requested to attend the assembly positively," Kma said.

If the JAC's demands are not fulfilled in a time-bound manner, the non-cooperation movement would be intensified, he added.

"We hope the VC understands the seriousness of JAC's demands and acts accordingly for the overall well-being of NEHU," he added.

Two dead, 51 injured in IED blasts at Christian prayer meeting in Kerala

Kochi, Oct 29 (PTI) Two women died and 51 persons were injured, some seriously, in multiple blasts at a Christian religious gathering in a convention centre near this port city on Sunday morning, sending shockwaves across Kerala.

The blasts took place at an international convention centre in Kalamassery, where hundreds of followers of the minority Christian group Jehovah's Witnesses had assembled on the concluding day of a three-day long prayer meeting.

A few hours after the incident, a man claiming to be a member of Jehovah's Witnesses, surrendered before police in Thrissur district of the state, saying that he carried out the multiple blasts.

Police have registered an FIR against unknown persons under Sections 302 (murder) and 307 (attempt

to murder) of the IPC, as well as provisions of the Explosives Act and the anti-terror law, Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

Later in the day, state Health Minister Venu George said that of the 51 injured, 30 were admitted in various hospitals in the state and of them 18 were in ICUs.

Of the 18, six - including a 12-year-old child - were in critical condition with three of them having suffered over 90 per cent burns, the minister said.

She said teams of plastic surgeons and general surgeons arrived at Kalamassery Medical College from Thrissur and Kottayam medical colleges.

Besides that, a 14-member medical board was also constituted to supervise the treatment being provided to the injured.

ADGP Law and Order M R Ajith Kumar told reporters here that a man named Dominic Martin had surrendered at Kodakara police station in the morning, claiming he was the one who set off the blasts.

The officer said the man gave evidence supporting his claim and the police were examining that as well as his claims and the reasons he gave for carrying out the act.

Prior to surrendering before the police, the man also put out a video message on a social media platform claiming responsibility for the blasts and stating his reasons.

In the video, which was aired on various TV channels, the man claimed that he took the decision as the teachings of the organisation were "seditions". No one from the organisation has reacted to

his allegations.

Meanwhile, a person claiming to be a member of the religious group told a TV channel that no such person was part of their organisation presently.

Martin further claimed that Jehovah's Witnesses and its ideology were dangerous for the country, and therefore its presence had to be ended in the state. He claimed that he had told the organisation several times to correct its teachings, but it was not ready to do so.

"As I had no other option, I took this decision," the man said.

Earlier, State Police Chief Shaik Darvesh Sahab told reporters in Thiruvananthapuram that according to the preliminary probe, an improvised explosive device (IED) was used to carry out the blasts.

Jehovah's Witnesses is a

Christian religious group that originated in the United States of America in the 19th century.

This morning at 9:30 am approximately there was an explosion in Zamrah International Convention Centre in Kalamassery in which one person died and 36 people are undergoing treatment as per our information, the DGP said.

"We are examining it," he said, adding that a Special Investigation Team (SIT) will be constituted once he reaches the site.

A police source told PTI that there were three blasts of which two were strong and the third was of low intensity.

On being asked whether tiffin boxes were used for packing the explosives as claimed by some news reports, the source said that it cannot be confirmed at this stage as the blast site was being examined by

multiple agencies including the state anti-terrorism squad and the National Investigation Agency (NIA).

Earlier, before Dominic Martin had surrendered, the DGP said he cannot say anything at this stage and only after further investigation can he confirm whether it was an act of terror.

He also urged people to maintain peace and remain calm and asked them not to spread provocative or hateful messages on social media.

The incident was termed as "shocking" by Kerala Governor Arif Mohammed Khan and "extremely unfortunate" by Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan.

"Shocked to hear about the blast at a religious gathering at Kalamassery,"

NEHU tussle: Sir to resume over demand to sack consultant

Shillong, Oct 29: There seems to be no end to the tussle between teachers, students and the vice chancellor of NEHU, Prof. Prabha Shankar Shukla.

The Joint Action Committee (JADC) comprising of NEHU Teachers' Association (NEHUTA), Meghalaya Tribal Teacher's Association (MeTTA), NEHU Student's Union (NEHUSU) and NEHU Non-Teaching Staff Association (NEHUNSA) have made up their mind to scale-up the intensity of the agitation against Prof. Shukla and decided to resort to non-cooperation movement starting with the upcoming Academic Council meeting on October 31.

It may be mentioned that the JAC has on October 19 served an ultimatum to Prof. Shukla to remove the "illegally appointed" contractual Technical Officer Senior Consultant Rohit Prasad.

Since the vice chancellor chose to side with the incumbent, ignoring the illegality and sentiments of the stakeholders, we are left with no other alternative but to go on an all-out protest starting with non-cooperation and non-

participation in the conduct of the upcoming 11th Academic Council meeting scheduled to be held on October 31 at 11 am in Multi-use Convention Hall," the JAC said today.

In addition to the demand for the immediate removal of Prasad, the JAC also put additional demands which include immediate appointment of the Statutory Officers, University Engineer and CDC Director, solution to problems of the University Health Centre, advertisement of non-teaching posts, problems faced by research scholars, relieving of teaching faculties and technical staff who are forced to perform ministerial duties, holding of regular convocation and steps to address security lapses within the campus.

"These are the long pending demands of the three recognised statutory associations of NEHU which the vice chancellor has chosen to ignore. As he has not respected the deadline of removal of Rohit Prasad nor initiated any process to fulfill the long pending issues of the three associations of NEHU as mentioned above, we are intensifying our agitation."

Solar power helps rural hospitals in State to carry on

Findings of WRI India on M'laya, 5 other states

Shillong, Oct 29: World Research Institute (WRI) India has found that decentralised solar energy (DRE) facilities have greatly benefited government hospitals in the rural areas of Meghalaya.

WRI on October 26 released a report titled "A Spoonful of Solar to Help the Medicine Go Down": Exploring synergies between healthcare and energy."

The report highlighted the critical role DRE plays in meeting the energy needs in rural and peri-urban health facilities in India.

The report analyses 22 DRE interventions implemented in health facilities across six states: Meghalaya, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, and Odisha.

The report is based on extensive literature review, in-person interviews and field visits to the health facilities.

It also stated that remote healthcare facilities, which are either un-electrified or function with unreliable grid

electricity, could access DRE to improve their service delivery and support more patients.

In Meghalaya, WRI visited the 100-bed Williamsnagar Civil Hospital, 30-bed Patharkmah Community Health Centre, two-bed Narang Health Sub-Center at Umiling and the 10-bed Bynihat Primary Health Centre.

Williamsnagar Civil Hospital was connected with rooftop solar energy of 38.7 kW (3 systems) with lead-acid battery backup (with grid charging). Patharkmah CHC was installed with 25.4 kW (2 systems) solar energy. Narang Health Sub-Center with 1.98 kW solar power and Bynihat PHC with 4.95 kW solar power.

The report informed that SELCO Foundation has been integrating energy efficiency within its projects in Meghalaya especially in the programme design phase, where the overall technology procurement considers

JAC to intensify stir against NEHU VC

The Joint Action Committee comprising several recognised statutory associations/ union of North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU) and spearheading the demand for resolution of issues concerning the university has decided to scale-up the intensity of the ongoing agitation against the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Prabha Shankar Shukla.

Accordingly, the JAC has decided to resort to non-cooperation movement starting with the upcoming Academic Council meeting against non-fulfillment of its demands.

The JAC president Prof Lakhon Kma in a statement informed that NEHU Student's Union (NEHUSU) has formally joined it to fight for the overall welfare of the University. At the same time, it thanked the Meghalaya Tribal Teacher's Association (MeTTA) for their full support to JAC. "JAC has viewed very seriously towards the Vice Chancellor of North-Eastern Hill University, Shillong Prof.

Prabha Shankar Shukla's casual and indifferent attitude with respect to the demands put forth by the three constituents of JAC—namely NEHUTA, NEHUNSA and NEHUSU for quite a long time," the statement said.

It said JAC the deadline vide letter No. JAC/2023/02 dated October 19, to remove the illegally appointed contractual Technical

Officer/Senior Consultant Rohit Prasad has expired. "Since the VC chose to side with the incumbent, ignoring the illegality and sentiments of the stakeholders, we are left with no other alternative but to go on an all-out protest starting with non-cooperation and non-participation in the conduct of the upcoming 111th Academic Council

meeting scheduled to be held on 31st October at 11 a.m. in Multi-use Convention Hall," the statement said.

Apart from the demand for removal of Rohit Prasad, the JAC listed several "genuine" long pending demands which the VC was supposed to fulfill in a time-bound manner.

These demands were: Immediate appointment of the Statutory Officers, University Engineer and Director, CDC; Deteriorating condition of the University Health Centre (Non-availability of medicines, testing facilities, etc.); advertisement of non-teaching posts; delay in functioning of GeM, hampering the procurement of everything in the University including medicines in health centre; and chemicals and reagents, affecting the student's practical and research work of PhD scholars; relieving of teaching faculties and technical staff who are forced to perform ministerial duties; non-holding of regular convocation and security lapses within the campus. **Contd. ▶ p3**
